## Questions and Answer on Shabbat XII

*Is it permitted to go swimming on Shabbat?*

Taking a splash on a hot afternoon is a great way to cool down and have fun; but not on Shabbat. The sages prohibited swimming in a river or lake on Shabbat since it could lead to repairing a raft (which would fall under the forbidden labor of “Makeh B’Patish” “administering the final hammer blow.

This prohibition extends to all situations, even in a scenario where there is no likelihood of repairing a raft, since rabbinic ordinances generally apply even when the original considerations and reasons for the prohibition are no longer applicable.

Although there is some basis in Jewish law to distinguish between rivers and certain swimming pools, not all pools could be excluded from this law.

Wetting a bathing suite is prohibited (wetting a fabric is considered “Melaben” - laundering). Moreover, there is a widespread custom not to immerse in (even cold) water if it is not for the purpose of a Mitzvah.

*Why is it forbidden to turn on the hot water faucet on Shabbat?*

When turning on the hot water you are automatically letting new water flow into the water boiler, where it is cooked. Cooking is one of the thirty-nine creative acts that are forbidden on Shabbat.

You could use the water from a percolator that was on since before Shabbat, or a samovar that's on the fire since Friday, to rinse hands or dishes.

*If there is a fire in my house on Shabbat, can I extinguish it?*

One cannot desecrate the Shabbat for the sake of saving monetary possessions. Practically speaking, unless you live in a desert far away from civilization every fire poses a danger to human life. Even if you and your family can evacuate the premises, the fire - which can easily spread - still poses a threat to your neighbours. So you must put out the fire, or at least get a non-Jew to put it out for you, unless you are positive that this fire will not put any life in harm's way.
