Questions and Answer on Shabbat X

How far am I allowed to walk on Shabbat?

- A. Because driving is prohibited on Shabbat, we walk rather than commute to Shul. However, even walking on Shabbat has its limits.
- B. Negative Mitzvah #321 sets a maximum walking range from one's city. The rabbis established the limit to be 2,000 cubits. Practically speaking, this means that you may not walk a straight line more than .59 miles (3161.74 ft. or 960 meters) in any direction in the wilds outside your city limits.
- C. "City limits" are not defined by the map you carry in your glove compartment. Halachah considers all contiguous housing to be part of the same city. Therefore it would be permitted to walk hundreds of miles, from city to city, as long as the whole way is populated.
- D. Therefore, this Mitzvah is usually not practicable if you live in the suburbs, and certainly if you live in any big city. Why? Because when G-d gave the Torah thousands of years ago, almost all of civilization lived in walled cities, with nothing but wilderness surrounding them. Today, you can walk for miles on end without seeing a single field or forest. Houses are everywhere, and cities just blend into each other with no spaces between, so you can't really set where civilization ends and wilderness begins. However, if you live in places with lots of raw country, the techum (pronounced teh-KHOOM), or perimeter, rule is very much in force and one has to be careful.

Is it permissible for me to put my pet bird in its cage on Shabbat?

Firstly, all living animals or birds are Muktzeh on Shabbat. Therefore it is obviously forbidden to pick up the bird in order to put it back into the cage.

If you are not actually handling the bird, but only verbally coaxing it, or chasing it, into the cage, or if it is already in the cage and you just want to close the door, then it would depend.

If the bird is domesticated to the extent that it does not resist you when you try to put it back into its cage, and the room where the cage is in is small enough that even if the bird wasn't domesticated you wouldn't have a tough time catching it, then it is permitted.

If, however, the bird is not domesticated or if the room is larger than above mentioned, then it is forbidden to get it into the cage or even just to close the door on it when it is inside.
